(c) Expenditure of federal economic stimulus funds for transportation purposes.

As soon as practical after the receipt of any federal economic stimulus funds, the governor shall submit to the joint committee on finance a plan or plans for the expenditure of the federal economic stimulus funds for transportation purposes.

After receiving the plan or plans, the cochairpersons of the joint committee on

finance jointly shall determine whether the plan or plans are complete. If the cochairpersons determine that the plan or plans are complete, the joint committee on finance shall meet and either approve or modify and approve the plan or plans within 14 days after the cochairpersons determine that the plan or plans are complete. The governor shall then implement the plan or plans as approved by the committee. This paragraph shall not apply to federal economic stimulus funds the expenditure of which is contained in any bill introduced in either house of the legislature at the request of the governor, including federal economic stimulus funds specified in Section 9150 (1) (b) 1. of this act.

(d) State building program enumeration. If any state building, structure, or facility is proposed to be designed or constructed, if any existing state building, structure, or facility is proposed to be repaired, remodeled, or improved, or if land is


