Tad:

Feel free to send the Senate Amendments to the budget to me. I'll be delighted to have them.

- 1) Oil profits tax. Insert a non-severability provision so that if the prohibition on passing through the tax to consumers is struck down by the courts, the entire tax is struck down.
- 2) Oil profits tax: Eliminate the entire provision.
- 3) Eliminate domestic partnership benefits for state employees.
- 4) Eliminate the domestic partnership registry.
- 5) Eliminate the provisions inserted in JFC related to creation of the slaughter fee and transfers from the Ag Chem account (delete point 2 from motion 529 and maintain current law).
- 6) Delete requirement for law enforcement to collect and report traffic stops for the purpose of racial profiling
- 7) Delete the handgun background check fee increases
- 8) Repeal the tax on digital products
- 9) Delete the new income tax bracket
- 10) Repeal the streamline sales tax
- 11) Delete the provision requiring choice schools with an enrollment of more than 10% limited-English proficient pupils to have a bilingual-bicultural education program. See JFC motion #700.
- 12) Delete provision in AB 75 providing \$71,300 in 2009-10 and \$92,900 in 2010-11 and 1.0 auditor position beginning in 2009-10 in a new appropriation funded from fees paid by schools intending to participate in the choice program. (See Sec. 2278 of AB 75, amending Wis. Stat. Sec. 119.23(2)(a)3
- 13) Delete JFC per pupil payment cut. Instead, return the MPCP funding to current law for the next two years (Gov's budget had it this way). Under that scenario, MPCP pupils would receive a % increase equal to the % increase in general school aids, but no less than zero. The result is no increase in 09-10 and a 1.7% increase in 2010-11 to \$6,719. Starting in 2011-12, modify the statute to provide the same funding as 2R charter schools received at JFC (see Motion # 607), which is an annual dollar increase equal to the increase in public school revenue limits.
- 14) Amend the provision requiring increased mandatory hours of instruction to apply only to schools facing deadlines for accreditation as of the date of enactment of the bill. (See Sec. 2281 of AB 75, creating Wis. Stat. Sec. 119.23(a)8). Schools
