SECTION 917. Nonstatutory provisions: Public Instruction

(1) ~~STATE AID~~ STATE AID: JUNE 2009. In the second fiscal year of the fiscal biennium in which this subsection takes effect, there is lapsed to the general fund \$291,000,000 from the appropriation account under section 20.255 (2) (ac) of the statutes. Notwithstanding sections 121.07 and 121.08 of the statutes, as affected by this act, the department of public instruction shall use the balance in that appropriation account and \$291,000,000 of the amount appropriated in the second fiscal year of the fiscal biennium in which this subsection takes effect under section 20.255 (2) (p) of the statutes, as created by this act, to make payments to school districts in June 2009 under section 121.15 (1) and (1g) of the statutes.

Please change this draft from an additional \$263 million lapse to the general fund in FY09 to an additional \$261,278,000 lapse to the general fund in FY09.

We would also like to change the GPR equalization aid and federal stabilization funding in FY10 and FY11 from what was proposed in AB 75. These changes are as follows: change the \$277 million federal stabilization funding (20.255(2)(p)) in FY10 to \$236,721,000 and increase GPR equalization aid (20.255 (2)(ac)) by \$40,279,000 in FY10 and eliminate the \$221 million federal stabilization funding entirely (20.255(2)(p)) in FY11 and increase GPR equalization aid (20.255 (2)(ac)) by \$221 million in FY11.

I am not sure if all of these changes can be included in one bill or if the FY09 lapse should be in one bill and the FY10 and FY11 changes should be included separately as an amendment to the budget.
