~~This amendment makes the changes (to the bill passed by the Senate) described in your message sent at 10:58 a.m. on Friday, September 18, as I understand them.~~

~~Under the bill as passed by the Senate (which consists of Senate Substitute Amendment 1, with Senate Amendment 1 thereto), manufacturers who failed to meet recycling targets would have to pay shortfall fees beginning in 2010. Under this amendment, manufacturers would not be required to pay shortfall fees until 2012. The bill eliminates the language concerning recycling targets and shortfall fees for 2010.~~

~~Under the bill as passed by the Senate, a manufacturer's target recycling weight is determined by multiplying the weight of the manufacturer's covered electronic devices sold in a specified prior year by 0.8. This amendment changes the multiplier to 0.6.~~

~~Under the bill as passed by the Senate, in determining whether a manufacturer met its target recycling weight, the manufacturer could count each pound of electronic waste collected in a rural county as 1.25 pounds. Under this amendment, each pound of electronic waste collected in a rural county may be counted as 1.5 pounds.~~

Under the bill as passed by the Senate, a manufacturer that exceeded its target recycling weight received one recycling credit for each pound of electronic waste over the target weight, but the number of credits is capped at 20 percent of the target weight. This amendment eliminates the 20 percent cap, but provides that in any program year a manufacturer may not satisfy more than 25 percent of its target weight requirement using credits.

Elise Nelson:
