## 2009 WISCONSIN ACT 102

AN ACT *to repeal* 343.31 (1) (hm); and *to amend* 343.30 (1g) (b) of the statutes; **relating to:** operating a motor vehicle while suspended, revoked, or disqualified.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

**SECTION 1.** 343.30 (1g) (b) of the statutes is amended to read:

343.30 (1g) (b) A court shall may revoke a person's operating privilege upon the person's conviction for violating s. 343.44 (1) (a), (b), or (d) or a local ordinance in conformity therewith if the person has been convicted of 3 or more prior violations of s. 343.44 (1) (a), (b), or (d), or similar violations under s. 343.44 (1), 1997 stats., or a local ordinance in conformity therewith, within the 5-year period preceding the violation. The Any revocation under this paragraph shall be for a period of 6

months, unless the court orders a period of revocation of less than 6 months and places its reasons for ordering the lesser period of revocation on the record.

**SECTION 2.** 343.31 (1) (hm) of the statutes is repealed.

## **SECTION 3. Initial applicability.**

(1) This act first applies to violations committed on the effective date of this subsection, but does not preclude the counting of other violations as prior violations for purposes of sentencing a person.

## **SECTION 4. Effective date.**

(1) This act takes effect on the first day of the 3rd month beginning after publication.
