

Good Morning Robin,

I received the bill draft (LRB 2930/1) yesterday and appreciate your quick response.

Following a review of the draft and checking with Mr. Furgal, who requested the re-introduction, I realize that a slight revision is needed.

After the public hearing for AB 578 last session, Rep. Musser offered Assembly Substitute Amendment 1. This amendment strengthened the language so that it specifies that "a court **must require** a person who is convicted of misappropriating, from a cemetery ..." The original bill says the court "**may require**..." so the court was *permitted* to order reimbursement. Obviously, this is a small but significant change, and seems to have been the intent when the bill made its way through both bodies last session. The bill passed the full Assembly, was messaged to the Senate and passed by the Senate Committee on Judiciary with the Substitute Amendment. So I believe we need to start at this point when we introduce the bill.

Please make this change in the language of LRB-2930. I apologize for the confusion.

This substitute amendment specifies that a court must require a person who is convicted of misappropriating, from a cemetery, an object that indicates that a deceased was a veteran, to reimburse the cost of replacing the object.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **Section 1.** 973.20 (15) of the statutes is created to read:
- 973.20 **(15)** If misappropriation, from a cemetery, of an object that indicates that a deceased was a veteran, as described in s. 45.001, is a crime considered at sentencing, the restitution order shall require that the defendant reimburse an individual, organization, or governmental entity for the cost of replacing the object.
