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## ASSEMBLY SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT 1, TO 2009 ASSEMBLY BILL 236

May 26, 2009 – Offered by Representative RADCLIFFE.

- 1 AN ACT *to amend* 118.33 (1) (a) 1. of the statutes; **relating to:** high school science
- 2 credits.

## Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a school board may not grant a high school diploma to any pupil unless the pupil has earned, in grades 9 to 12, at least four credits of English, three credits of social studies, two credits of mathematics, two credits of science, and 1.5 credits of physical education.

This substitute amendment requires a school board to award a pupil a science credit for completing in grades 9 to 12 each course in agriculture that the Department of Public Instruction (DPI) has determined qualifies as science according to criteria established by DPI.

## The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **SECTION 1.** 118.33 (1) (a) 1. of the statutes is amended to read:
- 4 118.33 (1) (a) 1. In the high school grades, at least 4 credits of English including
- 5 writing composition, 3 credits of social studies including state and local government,
