



2009 ASSEMBLY BILL 456

September 30, 2009 – Introduced by Representatives STEINBRINK, TURNER, SOLETSKI and A. OTT, cosponsored by Senators HOLPERIN and TAYLOR. Referred to Committee on Transportation.

1 **AN ACT** *to amend* 909.02 (4) of the statutes; **relating to:** self-authentication by
2 electronic certification of certain Department of Transportation records.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, documentary evidence offered before a court must meet certain requirements of authentication as a condition precedent to admissibility. Some documents, including official records, reports, and data compilations, are self-authenticating if specified requirements are met, so that extrinsic evidence of authentication is not required. Driver records maintained by the Department of Transportation (DOT) may be certified electronically by DOT as public records qualifying for self-authentication if the electronic certification is made in a manner determined by DOT to satisfactorily support a finding that the document is what it purports to be.

This bill allows DOT to electronically certify additional records, in the same manner that DOT electronically certifies driver records, so that these records are self-authenticating. The additional records that DOT may electronically certify for self-authentication purposes include motor vehicle title and registration records, motor vehicle dealer records, and motor carrier records.
