



2009 ASSEMBLY BILL 574

1 **AN ACT** *to amend* 59.84 (2) (j), 346.16 (2) (ar), 346.95 (5), 347.14 (1), 347.22,
2 347.245 (1) and 347.27 (3); and *to create* 285.30 (5) (L), 341.05 (27m), 346.94
3 (21) and 347.02 (1) (j) of the statutes; **relating to:** lightweight utility vehicles
4 and providing a penalty.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

5 **SECTION 1.** 59.84 (2) (j) of the statutes is amended to read:
6 59.84 (2) (j) *Traffic types and speed limits.* After an expressway project has
7 been certified as completed, the public body having jurisdiction over the
8 maintenance thereof shall have the power to regulate the type of vehicular use of
9 such portion of the expressway except as limited by federal and state laws and
10 regulations, and the power to fix speed limits thereon not in excess of the maximum

1 speed limits for state trunk highways, and to provide and enforce reasonable
2 penalties for infraction of such vehicular use regulation or speed limits.
3 Notwithstanding s. 346.16 (2), the use of the expressways by pedestrians, mopeds,
4 motor bicycles, motor scooters, bicycles, electric personal assistive mobility devices,
5 off-road utility vehicles, lightweight utility vehicles as defined in s. 346.94 (21) (a)
6 2. except when used to cross an expressway. funeral processions, and animals on foot
7 and the hauling of oversized equipment without special permit shall be prohibited
8 when an ordinance in conformity with this section and, with respect to prohibiting
9 the use of electric personal assistive mobility devices, in conformity with s. 349.236
10 (1) (a) or (b) is enacted by the board, but a forfeiture provided therein shall not exceed
11 the maximum forfeiture under s. 346.17 (2). The board may not prohibit the towing
12 of disabled vehicles on expressways, except that the board may prohibit the towing
13 of disabled vehicles during the peak hours of 7 a.m. to 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. to 6:30 p.m.
14 as established under county ordinance and except that the board may establish
15 procedures for and may contract for the towing of vehicles which have become
16 disabled on the expressway.

17 **SECTION 2.** 285.30 (5) (L) of the statutes is created to read:

18 285.30 (5) (L) A lightweight utility vehicle as defined in s. 346.94 (21) (a) 2.

19 **SECTION 3.** 341.05 (27m) of the statutes is created to read:

20 341.05 (27m) The vehicle is a lightweight utility vehicle, as defined in s. 346.94
21 (21) (a) 2.

22 **SECTION 4.** 346.16 (2) (ar) of the statutes is amended to read:

23 346.16 (2) (ar) Notwithstanding s. 349.105, no person operating an off-road
24 utility vehicle or a lightweight utility vehicle, as defined in s. 346.94 (21) (a) 2., may
25 go upon any expressway or freeway when official signs have been erected prohibiting

1 persons specified in par. (a) from using the expressway or freeway, except that a
2 lightweight utility vehicle may cross such an expressway or freeway.

3 **SECTION 5.** 346.94 (21) of the statutes is created to read:

4 346.94 (21) LIGHTWEIGHT UTILITY VEHICLES ON HIGHWAYS. (a) In this subsection:

5 1. “Agricultural operations” includes transporting farm implements,
6 equipment, supplies, or products on a farm or between farms.

7 2. “Lightweight utility vehicle” has the meaning given in s. 23.33 (11m) (a) 2.,
8 except that the term does not include a device that is equipped with a seat designed
9 to be straddled by the operator.

10 (b) 1. Notwithstanding s. 23.33 (11m), a person may operate in the conduct of
11 agricultural operations a lightweight utility vehicle on a highway, including any
12 roadway or, notwithstanding ss. 346.05 (1) and 346.08, any shoulder of a highway,
13 to cross the highway or to travel on the highway.

14 2. Any person operating a lightweight utility vehicle on a highway shall
15 exercise due care and, as far as is practicable, avoid interfering with the movement
16 of traffic.

17 3. Any person operating a lightweight utility vehicle upon any roadway shall
18 operate as close as practicable to the right-hand edge or curb of the unobstructed
19 roadway.

20 (c) Except as provided in par. (b) and s. 23.33 (11m), no person may operate a
21 lightweight utility vehicle on a highway.

22 **SECTION 6.** 346.95 (5) of the statutes is amended to read:

23 346.95 (5) Any person violating s. 346.94 (13) or (21) may be required to forfeit
24 not more than \$200.

25 **SECTION 7.** 347.02 (1) (j) of the statutes is created to read:

1 347.02 (1) (j) Lightweight utility vehicles, as defined in s. 346.94 (21) (a) 2.

2 **SECTION 8.** 347.14 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:

3 347.14 (1) No person shall operate a motor vehicle, lightweight utility vehicle
4 as defined in s. 346.94 (21) (a) 2., mobile home, or trailer or semitrailer upon a
5 highway unless such motor vehicle, lightweight utility vehicle, mobile home, or
6 trailer or semitrailer is equipped with at least one stop lamp mounted on the rear and
7 meeting the specifications set forth in this section. The stop lamp on a mobile home
8 or trailer or semitrailer shall be controlled and operated from the driver's seat of the
9 propelling vehicle. A stop lamp may be incorporated with a tail lamp. No vehicle
10 originally equipped at the time of manufacture and sale with 2 stop lamps shall be
11 operated upon a highway unless both such lamps are in good working order.

12 **SECTION 9.** 347.22 of the statutes is amended to read:

13 **347.22 Lamps on farm tractors and, self-propelled farm implements,**
14 **and lightweight utility vehicles.** (1) No person shall operate or park a farm
15 tractor or, self-propelled farm implement, or lightweight utility vehicle, as defined
16 in s. 346.94 (21) (a) 2., upon a highway during hours of darkness unless such tractor
17 or, implement, or lightweight utility vehicle carries the lighted headlamps and tail
18 lamps which would be required of other motor vehicles under similar circumstances.

19 (2) No person shall operate or park a farm tractor or, self-propelled farm
20 implement, or lightweight utility vehicle, as defined in s. 346.94 (21) (a) 2., upon a
21 highway during hours of darkness with any lamp thereon showing any light to the
22 rear other than red in color.

23 **SECTION 10.** 347.245 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:

24 347.245 (1) After January 1, 1970, no person may operate on a highway, day
25 or night, any vehicle or equipment, any animal-drawn vehicle, or any other

1 machinery, including all road machinery, that usually travels at speeds of less than
2 25 miles per hour or any vehicle operated under a special restricted operator's license
3 issued under s. 343.135 or any lightweight utility vehicle, as defined in s. 346.94 (21)
4 (a) 2., unless there is displayed on the most practicable visible rear area of the vehicle
5 or combination of vehicles, a slow moving vehicle (SMV) emblem as described in and
6 displayed as provided in sub. (2). Any towed vehicle or machine is exempt from this
7 provision if the towing vehicle is visible from the rear and is in compliance with this
8 section. All road machinery is excluded when it is engaged in actual construction or
9 maintenance work either guarded by a flagman or clearly visible warning signs.
10 Except as provided in s. 347.21 (1), the requirement of the emblem shall be in
11 addition to any lighting devices required or permitted by law. Mopeds and motor
12 bicycles are excluded from the provisions of this section unless they are operated
13 under a special restricted operator's license issued under s. 343.135. Electric
14 personal assistive mobility devices are excluded from the provisions of this section.
15 The SMV emblem need not be displayed on vehicles moving directly across the
16 highway.

17 **SECTION 11.** 347.27 (3) of the statutes is amended to read:

18 347.27 (3) In this section, "vehicle" includes farm tractors and self-propelled
19 farm implements, implements of husbandry, animal-drawn vehicles, lightweight
20 utility vehicles as defined in s. 346.94 (21) (a) 2., and road machinery.

21 **SECTION 12. Initial applicability.**

22 (1) This act first applies to vehicles operated on the effective date of this
23 subsection.
