- 1. In s. 346.94 (21) (a) 2., remove "and that, while being operated on a highway, is used exclusively in the conduct of agricultural operations" and instead place this restriction under par. (b).
- 2. Add a general prohibition against operating an LUV on a highway except as otherwise authorized. Set the penalties for violation of this prohibition similar to current law penalties for an unregistered LUV. 24.64

Larry,

As we discussed, if you could send the language changes to Aaron Gary regarding the considerations that the DOT had on LRB 3054/2 that would be greatly appreciated.


Here are the two considerations that need to be addressed:

- I suggest deleting the reference to 'used for agriculture' from the definition of LUV. Instead, limit the LUV definition to the vehicle type, and add the ag restriction wherever LUV use is allowed. For example, move the material related to ag operations from page 3, lines 22-23 to line 25. Notice how the lighting equipment standards applies only if the vehicle is an 'LUV as defined' (meaning it is engaged in ag ops) so an LUV can avoid any equipment violations by saying he's on his way to church.
- 2. Add a prohibition against operating LUV on highways, except as authorized under the chapter. This bill exempt LUV from registration, and there is no clear violation if an LUV is driven down the street between home and a grocery store. We need language to prohibit that.

Under current law, the Department of Natural Resources (DNR), in consultation with the Department of Transportation (DOT), administers a pilot program in eight counties to investigate the effects of using lightweight utility vehicles on trails and roadways authorized for all–terrain vehicle (ATV) use. For purposes of the program, a lightweight utility vehicle is defined as an engine–driven device having a gross weight of more than 700 pounds but not more than 1,999 pounds that is designed to travel on four or more low–pressure tires, is equipped with a cargo area, and is used primarily off a highway. (Lightweight utility vehicles are commonly known by their trade names, such as the John Deere Gator or Kubota RTV series.) Under the pilot program, any county or municipality within this eight–county area may elect to participate in the program and allow operation of lightweight utility vehicles on authorized ATV routes and trails, which may include designated portions of highways. The pilot program must end by September 30, 2009, and DNR must report the results of its program evaluation by January 1, 2010.





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

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the Department of Natural Resources (DNR), in consultation with the Department of Transportation (DOT), administers a pilot program in eight counties to investigate the effects of using lightweight utility vehicles on trails and roadways authorized for all-terrain vehicle (ATV) use. For purposes of the program, a lightweight utility vehicle is defined as an engine-driven device having a gross weight of more than 700 pounds but not more than 1,999 pounds that is designed to travel on four or more low-pressure tires, is equipped with a cargo area, and is used primarily off a highway. (Lightweight utility vehicles are commonly known by their trade names, such as the John Deere Gator or Kubota RTV series.) Under the pilot program, any county or municipality within this leight-county area may elect to participate in the program and allow operation of lightweight utility vehicles on authorized ATV routes and trails, which may include designated portions of highways. The pilot program must end by September 30, 2009, and DNR must report the results of its program evaluation by January 1, 2010.

This bill authorizes limited-purpose operation of lightweight utility vehicles on highways. Under the bill, a lightweight utility vehicle (LUV) is a lightweight utility vehicle as defined for purposes of the pilot program. A person may operate in the

• Note that the definition of ATV under current law allows ATVs to be up to 900 lbs. The definition of LUVs allows them to be from 700 to 1,999 pounds. The ATV definition requires that the vehicle have a seat that is straddled. The LUV definition does not have a seat type requirement. Therefore, it appears that heavier ATVs, those between 700 and 900 lbs, could both qualify as ATVs AND as LUVs. This would probably not be a big deal for purposes of the highway operation that you are authorizing, but it might create conflicts with registration requirements/exemptions, driver licensing conflicts, etc. You may want to consider beefing up the LUV definition so that it more effectively eliminates ATVs, for instance by requiring that the vehicle be manufactured with side-by-side seating or requiring that the vehicle not be manufactured with a seat that is straddled.

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
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
