Administrative Problem with Current Statute

This provision allows a person who has a disability that limits or impairs the ability to walk to obtain disabled license plates for a vehicle that the person leases. This provision was enacted many years ago, to parallel the provision relating to a person who owns a vehicle.

Several years ago, statutes were updated to reflect increased prevalence of leased vehicles. As part of this updating, S.341.01(2)(b) was created, which defines, for the purposes of Chapter 341, the term "owner" to include a person who leases a vehicle.

Therefore, S.341.14(1r) is redundant. In effect, this provision repeats S.341.14(1a).

Justification/Need for Change

The provision relating to leased vehicles is no longer needed. This would be clean-up of statutory language.




