This clearly goes beyond what we would normally include in a correction bill -- changing the meaning of an existing statute without an obvious structural error in the drafting.

As I said on the phone, ideally, an amendment would include a note explaining that the provision was added by amendment at the recommendation of Leg. Council to correct an ambiguity that has been identified and if you could provide a specific explanation of that ambiguity in the note that would lay out for everyone what is being done and why.

As to the history of amending correction bills, I can't say for certain that a correction has never been amended in my 18+ years of drafting them, but I believe that to be the case. And I can certainly state that a correction bill has not been amended to add a section that we would normally not have put into correction bill in the 1st place.

Bruce,

In 2009 act 12, "substantial wall" is defined as wall with an opening that may be used to allow air in from the outside that is less than 25% of the walls surface area. (Section 29)

However, because of the way that this is written, solid walls (ones without doors or windows) are not considered substantial. The adjustment Act 12, Section 29 would clarify that a wall without an opening, or a wall that has an opening that does not allow air in, is considered a substantial wall.

Another question for you? Do you have any information about previous revisors correction bills that have been amended? We are looking for some facts to back up what we are interested in doing.
