I'm not sure who's area this is but Senator Hansen would like to draft legislation providing insurance benefits to spouses and children of fallen firefighters.


We would like to make the legislation similar to that of Illinois.

Dear Senator Dave:

I was hoping that you could help me out with a few concerns that I have. First, since Arnie's death three years ago, I have been able to use his sick and vacation time towards coverage of my health and dental insurance through the city of Green Bay. Due to the expense, I got another insurance plan (Humana) for my 20 year old daughter, Kathryn, which is far from the benefits I receive. My san, Ryan, has been doing some research for me, and has found that the states of Minnesota and Illinois have public safety officer death benefits concerning health insurance. The Minnesota health insurance benefit pertains to career firefighters and states that, "for lineof-duty deaths, the employer shall continue to cover the firefighter's dependents, including the spouse. Employer is responsible for the employer's contribution for the coverage of the firefighter's dependents up to age 65 (MN Statutes 299A-465)." The health insurance benefit in Illinois also pertains to career firefighters and states: "Employer pays entire premium for the surviving spouse and each dependent child. Continues until child reaches age of majority or until the end of the calendar year in which the child reaches age 25 if the child continues to be dependent for support or is a full-time or part-time student and dependent for support. Remarriage of spouse terminates spousal coverage. Health insurance benefits from other sources reduce these benefits (Public Safety Employee Benefits Act Pub Act 90-535)." Could you check if there is some type of coverage in Wisconsin that I don't know about and if not, could some legislation be brought forward to allow for employer paid health and dental insurance for spouses and/or dependents of fallen public safety officers?

Second, again through research from my son, it was found that Arnie's pension should be tax exempt, due to the Fallen Hero Survivor Benefits Act of 2001 (P.L. 105-34). Wisconsin adopted the treatment authorized by the Fallen Hero Survivor Act of 2001. Could you please get the Wisconsin Retirement System to report on the 1099R the benefit as being "not taxable"? Could that also be addressed, since each time that we file our


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taxes, our accountant has to write in a long explanation to the state and federal governments why we do not need to pay taxes on the pension?

Finally, I would like to know if there have been any developments on getting retroactive tuition coverage for my older son, Eric. Since the date of Arnie's death, Eric's tuition and fees have totaled \$19,560.32. (Fall 2006 \$2,857.96, Spring 2007 \$2,857.96, Fall 2007 \$2,979.60, Spring 2008 \$2,979.60, Fall 2008 \$3,154.08, Spring 2009 \$3,154.08, Summer 2009 \$1,577.04)

Thank you for all of your past help since Arnie's death three years ago. In fact, today would have been our 30 year wedding anniversary which was also the day of Arnie's funeral. I think of your granddaughter often and hope that you and your family are doing well.

municipality Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

If a municipality (and city, village, or town) pays the health insurance premiums for its employees who are fire fighters, this bill requires the municipality to pay such premiums for the surviving spouse and dependent children of a fire fighter who dies, or has died, in the line of duty.

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The requirement created in the bill does not apply to a surviving spouse who remarries or reaches the age of 65, or to a dependent child who reaches the age of 18 and is not a full time high school student. The bill requires premium payments to be made for a dependent child who is a full or part-time student in an accredited college or university until the close of the kalendar year in which the individual reaches the age of 25.

The bill first applies, retroactively, to a fire fighter who has died in the line of duty before the effective date of the bill.

He would like the age of "25" changed to "27" in the analysis and on page 3, line 9 he said.


