Rep. Molepske has asked for a few changes with this LRB.

He wants the provision requiring a Plan (94.697 (2) removed, however, he wants to change that to Information Required - keeping lines 15 - 18 (list of pesticides, commercial applicator, etc.).

New provisions-

A copy of what is to be sprayed must be given to all train pilots that will be going through the affected area within the time limit for employees to stay out (reduce to 24 hours after spraying before work can begin in the affected area). This information must also be conspicuously posted where all train employees can see and read.

There can be no over spraying, and spraying must be limited to only the designated rights-of-way that the railroad owns (the target area).

No spraying during inclement weather.

There will be no spraying in bridge areas or along permanent waterways (creeks, streams, rivers, ponds, lakes).

Also, we spoke before about having DATCP promulgate rules to cover railroad workers in a similar way as agricultural workers are in ATCP 29. Do you have any suggestions on that?

Lloyd,

I have been looking at your message, the draft, and DATCP's rules about pesticide applications and have some questions. We can discuss this by phone or in a meeting if you want, but I thought it might help to provide the questions in writing first.

It isn't clear to me how proposed s. 94.697 (2) should be changed. Should it say that a railroad shall annually provide to the department the information on lines 15 to 18 relating to the its pesticide applications for the 9 months beginning on April 1? And then should sub. (3) require the railroad to make that information available to the same people listed in sub. (3) now? If not, what changes should be made?

Is the intent to delete proposed s. 94.697 (4) [page 3, lines 3 to 15]? If not, how should it be changed?

I am unsure of who is meant by "train pilot." Is it the individual operating the engine? In agent for the recitrocal who takes contractors along the rights-of-way and slows them where to spray. Also to DATCP's rules regarding pesticide application address the issue of overspray:

\*\*Tocal marks\*\* First line supervisor\*\*

ATCP 29.50 (2) (a) No person may use or direct the use of a pesticide in a manner that results in pesticide overspray or significant pesticide drift. This paragraph does not apply to mosquito control applications, made by or under the direction of a governmental entity for public health purposes, that use proper mosquito control application methods.

Overspray is defined as "pesticide deposited outside a target application site as a result of an applicator's failure to control the direct flow or application of pesticide from the application equipment so as to confine it to the target application site" and drift is "pesticide deposited outside a target application site as a result of pesticide movement caused by air currents or diffusion."

DATCP's rules also prohibit causing a pesticide to enter the waters of the state and using a pesticide in any manner which the user knows or should know will result in contamination of the waters of the state. ATCP 29.50 (4). (I believe that DNR also has rules in this area.)

Do the current rules adequately address the concerns in the second and fourth items under "new provisions"?

Regarding rules to protect railroad workers, I think that the draft could require DATCP to promulgate rules that provide railroad workers with equivalent protection to that provided to agricultural workers by DATCP's rules and federal regulations. How does that sound? Should some of sub. (5) be deleted or changed (other than changing 48 hours to 24 hours)?

I am sorry for the delay in getting back to you: things had really piled up when I returned from vacation.


