After having a few meetings with DATCP, we would like to ask for a substitute amendment with the following:

Remove language regarding notification of landowners. Mandate that the information be publicly available on their website and that they contact municipalities along the route to be sprayed prior to spraying (48 hours minimum).

RR must post pesticide safety information at a central location accessible to RR workers no later than 48 hours before the spraying this information shall include:

- 1. An EPA pesticide safety poster;
- 2. The location and description of the are to be treated;
- 3. The product name, EPA registration number and active ingredients of the pesticide;
- 4. The time and date the pesticide is to be applied;
- 5. The restricted-entry interval for the pesticide;
- 6. Access to the pesticide label
- 7. DATCP contact information.
- 8. Emergency medical contact information.

This information must remain posted at the central location for 30 days following application of the pesticides.

JThis same info should be shared on company website and with local towns/cities (DATCP should enforce).

RR must provide pesticide safety training to all employees (this is done by the pesticide contractors for agricultural workers) annually and keep records of the date of the training, employees attending and name/employer of the trainer. (DATCP to monitor/enforce).

Restricted-entry interval is specified on the product label. Bill should specify that reentry interval should comply with label time frames.

√Personal Protective Equipment is already federal law – not needed in bill.

DATCP doesn't need the rule making authority or the fees.

This bill requires a railroad to annually make information about its pesticide use available to the railroad's employees and those who own land adjacent to the railroad's rights—of—way. The bill generally prohibits a railroad from requiring a person to work in an area to which a pesticide has been applied within 24 hours of the application of the pesticide.

The bill requires DATCP to establish, by rule, fees to be paid by railroad companies to cover the costs DATCP incurs under the bill. The bill also requires DATCP to promulgate rules to limit the times and weather conditions in which pesticides may be applied by railroads to prevent damage to lands adjoining rights-of-way and to protect the health of employees of railroads and their contractors.



Pesticide Use by Railroads Comments on Preliminary Draft Assembly Substitute Amendment to AB 314

94.697(2)(a) and (c)

Suggest deleting the existing proposed section (c) and including supervisors under 94.687(2)(a). Could include supervisors at the end of line 6 to read, "...accessible to employees and employees' supervisors of the railroads". Recommend a new subsection (c) as described below.

Suggest deleting the language in lines 7, 8, and 9 re: providing the information to the public and to each city, village and town. The information provided to the public and the cities, villages and towns will be different and less specific than the information provided to employees.

Suggest making this a separate subsection in the information required section. Recommend using some of the original AB 314 language for a revised subsection (c) that would say something like this,

"A railroad shall annually, by March 15, make information available to the public on its website concerning its planned pesticide activities for the 9 months beginning on April 1, and shall notify annually, by March 15, the clerk of each city, village and town in which the pesticide will be applied that the information is available. The information shall include:

 A list of the pesticides that are expected to be used, their active ingredients and their registration numbers under the federal act.

• Where the complete pesticide label is available to review.

- The name and contact information for each commercial application company or commercial applicator-for-hire with whom the railroad contracts to apply pesticides.
- The months in which applications are planned to occur.

If you prefer the information be made available prior to the applications, you could change the timeline from what we have above.


