SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

New Act

Creates the Movable Soccer Goal Safety Act. Provides that a person, in setting up a movable soccer goal for use, must follow all applicable guidelines for anchoring, securing, and counterweighting the movable soccer goal that are set forth in "Guidelines for Movable Soccer Goal Safety", published by the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission. Provides that a violation of the Act is a petty offense for which a fine not to exceed \$500 may be imposed.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the Movable Soccer Goal Safety Act.

- "Movable soccer goal" means a freestanding structure consisting of at least 2 upright posts, a crossbar, and support bars that is designed:

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill requires the Department of Commerce (department) to promulgate rules that establish safety standards for erecting movable soccer goals. The bill prohibits a person from erecting a movable soccer goal unless the person erects the goal in a manner that is consistent with the rules promulgated by the department.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 167.21 of the statutes is created to read:

167.21 Movable soccer goals. (1) In this section:

(a) "Commission" means the federal consumer product safety commission.

(b) "Department" means the department of commerce.

(c) "Movable soccer goal" means a freestanding structure consisting of a least

2 upright posts, a crossbar, and support bars that is designed to be used as a soccer

goal and to be movable to different locations.

SECTION 1

1 (2) The department shall promulgate rules that establish safety standards for anchoring and securing, and using counterweights on, movable soccer goals. The standards shall be consistent with guidelines for movable soccer goal safety published by the commission in January 1995.

(4) A person who violates sub. (3) is subject to a forfeiture of not more than \$500.

Section 2. Effective dates. This act takes effect on the day after publication.
