Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The fiscal effect is in indeterminate. Reducing the years to qualify for the presumption does not cause a direct increase in cost for the state. Early indication of a disease may not decrease cost either. However, this depends on the strength or complexity of the disease upon diagnosing from case to case.

Among the occupations affected by this bill, the Department employs only 416 law enforcement officers: 317 State Patrol troopers and 99 State Patrol inspectors.
