<b>Description</b> Issuing annual vehicle admission receipts for motor buses for entry to state parks and other vehicle admission areas under the jurisdiction of the Department of Natural Resources					

### Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Bill Summary: AB 94 requires that the Department issue annual stickers for motor buses entering certain state parks, forests and natural areas and sets fees for these stickers, including a fee for each additional sticker issued for a motor bus owned by the same business or entity. Under current law, the Department may only issue daily admission stickers for motor buses. The fees established by the bill for the annual stickers are \$300 for a resident motor bus and \$50 for each additional motor bus owned by the same company, and \$450 for a non-resident motor bus, and \$50 for each additional motor bus owned by the same company.

Fiscal Effect: The Department assumes the vast majority of operators who buy daily stickers do not intend to make 30 or more repeat visits to Department properties, and therefore would likely not purchase an annual admission sticker. However, the Department would likely issue annual stickers to certain motor bus tour operators who make repeat trips to certain properties. Based on an analysis of data from a two year period, the Department was only able to identify one tour bus company operator that made more than 30 annual visits to Department properties, and that one resident operator of a motor bus tour company purchased, on average, 327 daily stickers per year. Assuming that one operator would purchase an annual admission sticker (and one additional resident annual sticker) rather than paying 327 daily fees, based on the fees specified in the bill, the Department would experience an annual net reduction in revenue of approximately \$3,000 under the bill. This would include a revenue decrease of \$3,270 (327 motor bus visits X \$10 daily admission fee) and a revenue increase of \$350 (assuming \$300 for one resident annual motor bus admission sticker + \$50 for one additional resident annual sticker).

The Department would incur both one-time and ongoing administrative expenses to fulfill the requirements of AB 94. The Department anticipates the need to update its public information to reflect the addition of a new annual motor bus sticker, including its visitor guide, Internet site, and all printed fee materials. Should the implementation date of the bill require the Department to issue a special printing of visitor guides that include the new annual sticker prior to the time a periodic update would occur, the one-time costs in the first year for a special printing are estimated to be \$18,200. This includes approximately \$16,000 in printing costs for the visitor guide, \$1,000 to update all Internet-related materials, and \$1,200 to update all signage and printed materials at all affected state parks, forests and natural areas, as well as updating internal remittance forms and operating manuals. However, should the date of implementation be delayed until the Department updates its materials on a normal replacement basis, the one-time costs related to a special reprinting of the visitor guide would not be incurred.

The Department estimates annual costs of approximately \$1,000 under the provisions of this bill. These costs include approximately \$750 in additional programming costs to annually update the Department's on-line sticker management database, and an additional \$250 in sticker printing, mailing and remittance costs to accommodate the two new admission stickers authorized by the bill.
