## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill imposes a complete ban on smoking in health care facilities, prisons and jails, retail establishments, restaurants, and governmental buildings. These facilities will no longer be able to designate indoor areas in which smoking would be allowed, as is the case under current law. The bill also prohibits smoking in any public place or place of employment.

Based on studies of the effect of smoking bans in other states, Medicaid costs in Wisconsin are expected to decrease as a result of a statewide smoking ban. A 2003 study of a proposed statewide smoking ban in Florida found that there would be immediate healthcare savings from the prevention of cardiovascular disease, prevention of low birth weight infants, and prevention of respiratory illnesses in children ages 0-5. The savings are due principally to reduced exposure to secondhand smoke. The study estimated that \$6.8 million AF would be saved annually in Florida as a result of the smoking ban.

To arrive at the estimated Wisconsin Medicaid cost-savings from a smoking ban, the Florida estimates were converted to 2009 dollars, pro-rated to Wisconsin based on population, and then pro-rated to Medicaid savings based on the proportion of the Wisconsin population in MA.

Using the 2009 consumer price index average annual growth percentage, it is estimated that the \$6.8 million AF savings projected in the Florida study would be the equivalent of \$10.2 million AF in 2009. Since Wisconsin's population is approximately 30% that of Florida's, Wisconsin's annual savings for its entire population is estimated to be \$3.1 million AF. Assuming Wisconsin's Medicaid population is 14.4% of its total population, the smoking ban would result in savings to Medicaid of \$298,600 GPR and \$455,900 FED, for a total reduction of \$754,500 AF annually by FY 11. The savings will likely grow over time.
