Description									
Designating a portion of the Brunsweiler River as a wild river									

#### **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

The bill designates a portion of the Brunsweiler River, which is primarily located within the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest, as a state wild river under s. 30.26 Wis. Stat. The bill also allows for the maintenance and replacement of a small number of existing piers and a boat landing, as well as maintenance of an existing dam.

Assumptions for state fiscal effect:

- 1. Management of the Brunsweiler wild river can be conducted by existing DNR staff, and will largely involve coordination with the U.S. Forest Service. It will also include evaluation of state wild river requirements when Chapter 30 or 31 permit applications are received by Department staff.
- 2. NR 302 of Wis. Admin. Code establishes a management program to protect legislatively designated state wild rivers; however, no revision of NR 302 will be necessary.
- 3. An inventory of the piers existing on the effective date will be necessary. Documentation of these piers will be placed in DNR files so that the U.S. Forest Service and other owners can be permitted to repair and replace these piers up to their current size and in keeping with state requirements. It is anticipated there are five or fewer piers in existence on this segment of the river.
- 4. A Memorandum of Understanding will need to be developed between the DNR and the U.S. Forest Service.
- 5. We do not anticipate substantial changes in management of the Brunsweiler River or lands along the Brunsweiler River as a result of this wild river designation. The river in this segment flows through mostly U.S. Forest Service land. The river is also designated an Outstanding Resource Water in Chapter NR 102, Wis. Admin. Code.
- 6. DNR staff may be called upon to provide information to the public concerning the Brunsweiler wild river designation.
- 7. Duties of the Department with respect to state wild rivers include active leadership in developing practical management policy, consultation with other agencies and planning committees, and collaboration with county and town boards.

#### Estimated one-time costs:

Develop MOU and coordinate with U.S. Forest Service, inventory existing piers, provide public information.

DNR Lake Superior basin supervisor: 60 hours @ \$33.47 per hour plus fringe = \$2,980

DNR Ashland County Water Management Specialist: 20 hours at 28.61 per hour plus fringe = \$850

DNR Forestry: 8 hours at \$28.61 per hour plus fringe = \$340.

DNR Attorney review: 2 hours at \$31.43 per hour plus fringe = \$90

DNR Lands Division management input: 8 hours at \$37.70 per hour plus fringe = \$450

Additional travel costs \$100.00

Total one-time costs to implement program = \$4,800

#### Estimated ongoing costs:

Coordinate with U.S. Forest Service, coordinate with planning committees, county and town boards as needed, evaluate Chapter 30 and Chapter 31 permit applications with regard to wild river requirements on Brunsweiler wild river segment, and provide public information.

DNR Lake Superior basin supervisor: 8 hours (including fringe) = \$400

DNR Ashland County Water Management Specialist: 8 hours (including fringe) = \$350

Additional travel costs \$50.00 Total annual projected cost to implement program = \$800

The bill would have no fiscal effect at the local government level.
