Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Prosecutors believe that this bill, should it be enacted, will have a small to moderate effect on their workload. It is difficult to quantify how much of an addition to the workload this means per office, or how many additional prosecutors will be needed, but DAs indicated it would impact their office's workload.
