Assembly Bill 542, authored by Representative Jason Fields, was jointly referred to the Committees on Urban and Local Affairs and the Joint Survey Committee on Retirement Systems.

According to ss. [13.50](#), because this bill does not affect the Wisconsin Employee Trust Fund, it is not necessary the bill be heard by the Joint Survey Committee on Retirement Systems. I am therefore suggesting that in the interest of expediency during these final weeks of session the bill be withdrawn from the Joint Survey Committee and allowed to proceed.
