

WISCONSIN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ACT MEMO

2009 Wisconsin Act 88 [2009 Senate Bill 253] Traffic Control Devices Used by School Safety Patrols

Current law provides that traffic control devices containing advertising are not permitted on highways. An *exception* is provided for the use of certain flags by members of *school safety patrols* to warn traffic that children are about to cross the roadway. To meet the exception, a school safety patrol flag must be *federal yellow*, *24 inches square*, bear the words "safety patrol" or "school," and be attached to a lightweight pole eight feet or less in length.

2009 Wisconsin Act 88 specifies that the school safety patrol flag exception also includes flags that are *fluorescent yellow* and not less than 20 inches nor more than 24 inches square.

Effective date: 2009 Wisconsin Act 88 took effect on December 16, 2009.
