2009 Wisconsin Act 231 [2009 Senate Bill 287] American Indian Tribe: Transfer Ownership and Jurisdiction of a Highway

2009 Wisconsin Act 231 authorizes a city, village, town, or county (political subdivision) or the Department of Transportation (DOT) to transfer jurisdiction and ownership of, or other property interest in, a highway that is under the jurisdiction of the political subdivision or DOT to a federally recognized American Indian tribe or band in this state (tribe or band) or an agency of the United States government acting on behalf of a tribe or band (agency). The political subdivision or DOT would be required to enter into a jurisdictional transfer agreement with the tribe or band or agency that must contain:

- A dispute resolution procedure.
- A provision requiring that the highway remain open to vehicular traffic unless the tribe or band or agency conducts a highway discontinuation proceeding similar to the proceeding that would occur if the city, village, or town in which the highway is located were discontinuing the highway.

Effective date: 2009 Wisconsin Act 231 takes effect on May 20, 2010.
