Current law requires that each school board provide an instructional program designed to give pupils knowledge of state, national, and world history.

2009 Assembly Bill 172 provides that the instructional program designed to give pupils knowledge of state, national, and world history must include knowledge of the history of organized labor in America and the collective bargaining process.

Assembly Substitute Amendment 2 provides that the state superintendent must incorporate the history of organized labor and the collective bargaining process into the model academic standards for social studies.

Legislative History

Assembly Substitute Amendment 2 was offered by Representatives Jorgensen, Vukmir, Kramer, Sinicki, and Krusick. On April 28, 2009, the Assembly adopted the substitute amendment. The Assembly then passed the bill, as amended, on a vote of Ayes, 61; Noes, 38.
