Assembly Bill 47 creates a martial arts instructor permit. A person who has been convicted of a disqualifying offense cannot obtain a permit and cannot provide martial arts instruction. The term “disqualifying offense” includes over 60 individual crimes. The fee for the instructor permit is \$53.

Senate Amendment 1 provides that a person who is a disqualified offender cannot obtain a permit and cannot provide martial arts instruction. A disqualified offender is a person who is required to register as a sex offender or who has been convicted of first-degree intentional homicide.

Legislative History

On January 19, 2010, the Senate Committee on Judiciary, Corrections, Insurance, Campaign Finance Reform, and Housing introduced and adopted Senate Amendment 1 to Assembly Bill 47 and recommended concurrence in the bill, as amended, both on votes of Ayes, 5; Noes, 0.
