Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a person licensed to practice the profession of optometry by the Optometry Examining Board (board) in the Department of Regulation and Licensing may, among other practices, prescribe contact lenses. If the person was first licensed on or after August 1, 2006, or holds a certificate issued by the board, the person may also prescribe or administer drugs for ocular therapeutic purposes. However, the person may not dispense drugs.

This bill permits a person licensed to practice the profession of optometry who is authorized to prescribe or administer a therapeutic pharmaceutical agent to dispense contact lenses that deliver the therapeutic pharmaceutical agent.
