



## 2009 SENATE BILL 83

February 20, 2009 – Introduced by Senators LEIBHAM and OLSEN, cosponsored by Representatives BIES, A. OTT, SPANBAUER and TOWNSEND. Referred to Committee on Judiciary, Corrections, Insurance, Campaign Finance Reform, and Housing.

1 **AN ACT** *to create* 968.255 (7) (e) of the statutes; **relating to:** strip searches.

### *Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau*

Current law provides a number of restrictions on the manner in which strip searches and body cavity searches may be conducted. Those restrictions do not apply to certain searches of certain persons, such as a search of a person serving a sentence, pursuant to a conviction, in a jail, state prison, or house of correction. This bill provides an additional exception so that the restrictions on strip searches and body cavity searches do not apply to a search of a person who is found or alleged to have violated a condition of probation.

2 **SECTION 1.** 968.255 (7) (e) of the statutes is created to read:

3 968.255 (7) (e) Is found, or is alleged, to have violated a condition of probation.
