Dear Representative Black,

As a member of the Assembly Natural Resources Committee, I respectfully request a public hearing for Clearinghouse Rule (CR) 08-111, relating to the management of accumulate sediment from storm water management structures.

The plain language analysis of the rule points to the ever increasing volume of sediment requiring responsible management which indicates the need for employing a certification form that ensures accumulated sediment meet risk-based requirements to protect health and the environment. However, it also points out that those affected by the rule include municipalities and county government, commercial and residential developers and owners, consultants, environmental groups and citizens.

Since the proposed rule will affect such a vast cross-section of individuals and units of government and in order to ensure effective citizen participation in the rulemaking process, I request that a public hearing be held on 08-111 to address the matter of documenting the removal of accumulated sediment and its effects on Wisconsin government, citizens and businesses.
