Testimony from Wendy Arnone

Chairman Erpenbach and Committee Members.

I am happy to be here with you today and appreciate you taking the time to schedule this hearing to consider my nomination to serve as an insurer representative on the Health Insurance Risk-Sharing Plan, or HIRSP, Authority Board.

My name is Wendy Arnone and I am the president and chief executive officer of UnitedHealthcare of Wisconsin, a subsidiary of UnitedHealth Group.

UnitedHealthcare provides a full spectrum of consumer-oriented health benefit plans and services, helping approximately 26 million individual consumers nationwide achieve improved health and well-being through various health service systems.

In Wisconsin, UnitedHealth Group serves approximately 1.1 million members, contracts with more than 15,000 physicians and 118 hospitals, and employs more than 5,700 individuals with offices in: Green Bay; Milwaukee; Wauwatosa; Wausau; Eau Claire; Onalaska; Pewaukee; Brookfield; and Appleton. Annually, UnitedHealth Group invests approximately \$400 million in our state's economy through taxes and wages.

As you all probably know, Wisconsin's health insurance risk-sharing plan offers health insurance coverage to residents who are unable to obtain adequate coverage in the private market due to a medical condition, or who have lost their group health insurance coverage.

HIRSP is financed through the policyholder premiums and assessments collected from health insurance companies in the state, with healthcare providers contributing to HIRSP through their acceptance of reduced reimbursement rates for their covered medical services provided to HIRSP policyholders. In 2008, UnitedHealth Group paid a total assessment of approximately \$6.4 million to HIRSP.

Throughout my professional career, I have experienced first hand the need for, and importance of, access to quality, affordable healthcare for individuals.

When I started my career as a Registered Nurse in Upstate New York, I saw the challenges faced by individuals who had gone for too long without insurance coverage and as a result visited our Emergency Room for procedures that could have been dealt with through routine visits and quality care management.

During my time in Network Management, I learned about the positive impact network relationships between providers and insurers have on decreasing healthcare costs while increasing the quality of care through the implementation and utilization of disease and quality management programs.

And, in my current role, I hear everyday about the high cost of healthcare in the state and look for ways to leverage the resources of UnitedHealthcare to make healthcare more affordable while providing quality care management and wellness programs for our 1.1 million members.

The Wisconsin HIRSP authority is one tool in our state's health insurance tool box and plays a critical role by providing affordable, quality care for 16,500 citizens.

Based on my personal and professional experiences, I feel that I would be qualified to serve as an insurer representative on the HIRSP Board and would appreciate your support for my nomination.
