January 2011 Special Session Assembly Bill 8. Relating to: the authority of a state agency to promulgate rules interpreting the provisions of a statute enforced or administered by the agency and to implement or enforce any standard, requirement, or threshold as a term or condition of a license issued by the state agency; gubernatorial approval of proposed administrative rules; economic impact analyses of proposed rules and emergency rules; and venue in a declaratory judgment action seeking judicial review of the validity of an administrative rule and in an action in which the sole defendant is the state. (FE) By Committee on Assembly Organization, by request of Governor Scott Walker and Representative Tiffany. **(Report adoption of Senate Amendment 1, Ayes 5, Noes 2, concurrence as amended recommended by committee on Economic Development and Veterans and Military Affairs, Ayes 4, Noes 3)**
