Under the federal Workforce Investment Act of 1998, local workforce development boards (local boards) are established throughout the state to provide employment and training activities in the areas served by those local boards. This bill requires the Department of Workforce Development (DWD), when a claimant applies for unemployment insurance benefits, to notify the local board serving the area in which the claimant resides and the local board, on receiving that notice, to provide to the claimant information on the career planning, job search, job skills training, and other support services that are available in the area served by the local board for individuals seeking employment.

Under current law, any employer employing 50 or more persons in this state (employer) who decides upon a permanent or temporary shutdown that affects 25 or more employees (business closing) or upon a reduction in force affecting at least 25 percent of the employer's workforce or 25 employees, whichever is greater, or of affecting at least 500 employees (mass layoff) must notify, among others (DWD) and 2) any employee who loses, or who may reasonably be expected to lose, his or her employment with the employer because of the business closing or mass layoff (affected employee). The notice to an affected employee must include contact

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information for the local board serving the area in which the employment site is located and, if available, a list prepared by the local boar of resources that provide support services to affected employees. This bill requires an employer that decides upon a business closing or mass layoff to also provide notice of that action to the local board serving the area in which the employment site is located.
