Whereas, Nathan A. Fishbach earned his undergraduate degree, Phi Beta Kappa, from George Washington University in 1974, and his law degree from Villanova University Law School in 1978; and

Whereas, Nathan A. Fishbach married Susan Stolzer and they moved to the State of Wisconsin after law school, where they had three sons: Jeffrey, Brian and Michael; and

Whereas, Nathan A. Fishbach served in the U.S. Attorney's Office for the Eastern District of Wisconsin for 13 years, under Presidents of both parties, where he held a variety of posts, including Interim U.S. Attorney, Deputy U.S. Attorney and Civil Division Chief, and focused the majority of his work on the prosecution of complex financial cases, serving with tremendous skill and dedication; and

Whereas, Nathan A. Fishbach entered the private practice of law with Whyte Hirschboeck Dudek S.C., where he focused his practice for the next 18 years on complex civil and white-collar litigation, and represented corporations, government entities and professionals in compliance matters; and

Whereas, Nathan A. Fishbach was a co-founder and past President of the Eastern District of Wisconsin Bar Association and a past President of the Milwaukee Bar Association; and

Whereas, Nathan A. Fishbach's leadership also included chairing the Magistrate Judge Merit Selection Committee - Eastern District of Wisconsin; and the State Bar of Wisconsin's Board of Governors; serving on ALFA International's Board of Directors; co-chairing the Milwaukee Bar Association's Sesquicentennial Steering Committee; and serving on the Federal Nominating Commission - Wisconsin; Sen. 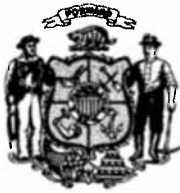
