A requirement that termination of parental rights petitions be filed with respect to children under eight years of age, and certain children eight years of age or over, who have been placed outside the home for six months.

## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

District Attorneys provided a mixed response concerning the potential fiscal impact of this bill. One DA office responded that there would be no fiscal effect; however, another office reported they would need additional personnel (e.g. - 1 to 1.5 additional ADAs in one county). Another DA office reported that the fiscal impact would be great because they would be filing many more Termination of Parental Rights (TPRs) cases, though they could not determine the exact number of additional TPR cases. They stated that the vast majority of children in out-of-home care are out of the home for at least 6 months, which would require the filing of a TPR petition.

## **Long-Range Fiscal Implications**

DAs provided a mixed reaction to this bill. In some cases, DAs believe that the bill will have no fiscal impact; however, other DAs believe it will require additional ADAs.
