Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

District Attorneys provided varying points of view regarding the potential fiscal impact of this bill. Some DAs believe that the bill would not result in a fiscal impact and, in fact, may eliminate delays and duplication of proceedings caused by defendants who want to substitute a judge.

Other DAs indicated that enactment of this bill will increase their workload. Defendants who are forced to appear in front of a judge that they would have substituted will most likely want the matter decided by a jury rather than the judge, thereby increasing the number of jury trials.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

DAs provided differing opinions about whether or not the enactment of this bill would have a fiscal impact on their offices.
