If enacted, the bill creates the Wisconsin Venture Capital Authority. The authority would oversee programs related to venture capital investments in Wisconsin business.

The bill creates an authority governed by a board of directors. The board of directors consists of the chief executive office of the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation and various others appointed by the governor and the speakers of the Senate and the Assembly.

The secretary of the Department of Administration may be called upon, in coordination with the secretary of the Department of Commerce and the authority, to administer chapter 239 of the statutes as enumerated in the bill, until the initial appointments by the governor are made. This work can be absorbed by the agency, so there is no fiscal effect on DOA.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

Unknown
