Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This fiscal estimate addresses only the fiscal effect on local governments of this proposed legislation related to district and county fair aid.

Under current law, county and district fairs are required to submit information to the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) to obtain fair aids. Per 93.23.1(e) this information includes the assurance that only the permitted alcoholic beverages were allowed on the fairgrounds. As a part of its administrative oversight role, DATCP audits a certain number of the payment requests each year. These audit procedures would not change if this bill became law. No additional staff time or administrative activities would be required to respond to the changes proposed in this legislation and no additional procedures are anticipated.

Under current law fair aids to a given county or district fair could be impacted if a violation of 93.23 1(e)came to the attention of the department. The same would be the case under the proposed legislation. No additional oversight or enforcement is required by the legislation and, compared to current law, no additional impact on fair aids is expected.
