Please find attached a memorandum our office received from Dave Loppnow at the legislative Fiscal Bureau that explains the change to school district aid for referendums that we would like to have drafted into legislation.

We are seeking to provide additional state aid to assist school districts with the lowest equalized value per student in paying the debt servicing on referenda-approved borrowing for capital improvements. We would like to increase the maximum level for categorieal state aid to 85% for capital improvements. This additional assistance would recognize that the inability of these districts to raise funds through increases in property taxes — due to low property valuations in addition to newly imposed restrictions on borrowing, are potentially preventing low income areas in the State from being able to deliver educational programs in quality buildings.

At your request, I am providing information relating to a proposal to provide additional state aid to assist school districts with low equalized value per member in paying debt service on referenda-approved borrowing.

Under this proposal, school districts with an equalized value below 50% of the statewide average value per member used in the prior aid year would be eligible for additional state aid to pay debt service on bonding approved by a referendum held after July 1, 2011. As an example of the calculation of this threshold, in aid year 2010-11, the statewide average value per member is \$581,087, so 50% of that amount is \$290,544. Based on the 2010-11 general school aids printout prepared by the Department of Public Instruction, 10 school districts had an equalized value below 50% of the statewide average value per member used in that aid year. The attachment to this memorandum shows the 10 school districts as well as their membership and equalized value per member used in the 2010-11 aid year.

Under the proposal, eligible school districts would receive, as a first draw from general school aids, an amount equal to the percentage of shared costs the district received in general aids in the prior aid year times the current debt levy for bonding approved by a referendum held after July 1, 2011. The proposal would specify that: (a) no more than 10% of the initial amount of the bond issue could be paid off in any year; (b) shared costs in each aid year would be reduced by the amount of aid received under the proposal; and (c) DPI would apply the aid percentage to the debt levy each year for these bonds.

Because this aid would be provided only for the debt levy associated with bonds approved by referendum held after July 1, 2011, it is unknown which school districts would gain or lose aid under this proposal that would reallocate aid from other school districts. As general aid, these moneys from the state would be subject to revenue limits, but would have the effect of reducing the school district's controlled levy, which would reduce the net effect of an increase in the school district's debt levies to pay debt service on referenda-approved debt.



The school district may receive such aid in any year only if it repays no more than 10 percent of the principal of the bond in that year. Aid is paid as a first draw from the general school aid appropriation, thus reducing the amount distributed as general school aid to other school districts.

121.07 (7) (b) The "secondary guaranteed valuation per member" is an amount, rounded to the next lower dollar, that, after subtraction of payments under ss. 121.09, 121.10, and 121.85 (6) (b) 2. and 3. and (c), fully distributes an amount equal to the amount remaining in the appropriation under s. 20.255 (2) (ac).


