Kelley,

Dave and I talked about this proposal. It seems to us that if the issue is that certain school districts can't use the Act 10 provisions because there is a contract in place, they would need additional revenue limit authority to cover their costs, not necessarily just more state aid. A district's revenue limit covers the sum of state general aid and local property taxes. If you only give a district more general aid, its levy would go down. The district would not have additional funding to cover their costs.

Also, the reductions in revenue limits and general aid were made in 2011-12. There is no reduction in either revenue limits or general aid in 2012-13. Under revenue limits, there is a \$50 per pupil adjustment in 2012-13, with a \$50 match in categorical aid. The general aids appropriation increases by \$32 million in 2012-13 compared to the prior year.

One possible idea for your proposal would be to restore half of the 2011-12 reduction in revenue limits in only the 2012-13 school year for the eligible districts. In 2011-12, each district's revenue per pupil under revenue limits was reduced by 5.5%. This idea would restore half of that cut. If you want to give these districts some additional general aid to soften the levy increase, you could set up a first draw from the general aid appropriation in 2012-13 only to give eligible districts aid equal to half of the revenue limit increase.

That's just one idea. We'd be happy to work with you on other alternatives if you don't like that one.

Sen. Cullen would like a bill drafted to assist school districts whose employee contracts are still in place in the second year of this biennium (July 1, 2012 to June 30, 2013).

The bill should apply to school districts whose employee contracts were in place prior to Jan. 1, 2011, and whose contracts are still in place in the second year of this biennium. The bill should say that for those school districts, their cuts in state aid for that year should be **half** what the cuts otherwise would be.

The rationale is that these school districts don't have the "tools" the Governor gave them because the school board can't open up the contract and negotiate wage concessions.

#### **2011 BILL**

AN ACT *to amend* 20.255 (2) (ac) of the statutes; **relating to:** providing additional state aid and revenue limit authority for certain school districts and making an appropriation.

#### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill provides additional school aid in, and revenue limit authority for, the 2012–13 school year for certain school districts. The eligible school districts are those in which employees were covered by a collective bargaining agreement on January 1, 2011, that is in effect through the 2012–13 school year.

Under the bill, each eligible school district's revenue limit for the 2012–13 school year is increased by an amount equal to 50 percent of the decrease in the district's revenue limit in the 2011–12 school year. In addition, each eligible school district's state aid in the 2012–13 school year is increased by an amount equal to 60 percent of this revenue limit increase. The aid is paid as a first draw from the general school aid appropriation, thus reducing the amount of general school aid distributed to other school districts.
