Two bills are now active to significantly change the law relating to 3-vehicle combinations. They are AB-267 and SB-194. You may wish to speak with the offices of Sen. Lazich and/or Rep. Petrowski about them. Do you want an amendment drafted to these bills, or do you want an entirely new bill draft? If you want a bill draft, using Minnesota's law as the model may be complicated.
