Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

SB 316 would expand the eligibility criteria for the Workforce Advancement Training (WAT) grant program administered by the Wisconsin Technical College System (WTCS). This grant program provides training grants to local technical colleges that collaborate with employers to provide incumbent worker skills training.

The bill expands employer eligibility for small business grants to include employers of up to 250 individuals (up from current law, which allows employers of up to 100). The bill also broadens the types of activities eligible for grants to include assistance with market expansion or business diversification.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

Expanding grant eligibility and the types of activities funded may result in both increased competition for grant funds and decreased investments in skills training.
