## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

The State Public Defender (SPD) is statutorily authorized and required to appoint attorneys to represent indigent defendants in criminal proceedings. The SPD plays a critical role in ensuring that the Wisconsin justice system complies with the right to counsel provided by both the state and federal constitutions. Any legislation has the potential to increase SPD costs if it creates a new criminal offense, expands the definition of an existing criminal offense, or increases the penalties for an existing offense.

This bill updates the statutory references for several current offenses for fraud within an economic support program including Wisconsin Works, Medical Assistance, and supplemental nutrition programs. The offenses vary based, in most cases, on the value of the services. Criminal penalties range from a Class C misdemeanor to a Class G felony. In FY2011, the SPD's average cost to provide representation with a private bar attorney in a misdemeanor case was \$225.41 and in a felony case was \$613.83.

Because these are current crimes the SPD has no data to predict if there would be an increase in the number of cases as a result of this bill. Because of the annual caseloads for staff attorney positions specified for budgeting purposes under § 977.08(5), it would be more cost effective to add staff attorney positions should the bill result in a number of additional charges.
