## MEMORANDUM TO MEMBERS OF THE SENATE AND ASSEMBLY FROM THE WISCONSIN MUNICIPAL JUDGES ASSOCIATION December, 2011

The Wisconsin Municipal Judges Association has reviewed the implementation of 2009 Wis. Act 402 since its effective date of January 1, 2011. As might be expected with a bill which ran 49 pages, there are several areas that need to be addressed in a trailer bill. It is our understanding that a number of issues might be addressed by a bill put forward by the Law Revision Committee. They are as follows:



3) Many citations are now generated electronically, which makes the signature requirement of sec. 800.02(2)(a) difficult to enforce. We therefore need to add that the printed name of the issuing officer, etc., is sufficient on an electronically-generated citation or complaint. Suggested language follows:

800.02(2) FORM OF CITATION OR COMPLAINT. (a) The citation or complaint shall contain the name of a law enforcement officer, attorney representing the municipality, or if applicable, a conservation warden, official, or employee. In addition, the governing body of a municipality authorized to adopt the use of citations and complaints may designate by ordinance or resolution other municipal officials who are authorized to issue and be named in citations or complaints with respect to ordinances which are directly related to the official responsibilities of the officials. Officials granted the authority to issue and be named in citations or complaints may delegate, with the approval of the governing body, the authority to employees. Authority delegated to an official or employee may be revoked only in the same manner by which it is conferred.

Under current law, a citation or complaint alleging a violation of a municipal ordinance must be signed by a law enforcement officer, an attorney representing the municipality, or, under certain circumstances, a conservation warden, municipal official, or municipal employee (signatory). This bill permits the signature of the signatory to be made in writing or electronically.

## The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 800.02 (2) (a) of the statutes is amended to read:

800.02 (2) (a) The citation or complaint shall be signed by bear the written signature or electronic signature, as defined in s. 801.17 (1) (e), of a law enforcement officer, attorney representing the municipality, or, if applicable, a conservation warden. In addition, the governing body of a municipality authorized to adopt the use of citations may designate by ordinance or resolution other municipal officials

who may sign, by written signature or electronic signature, as defined in s. 801.17 (1) (e), and issue citations with respect to ordinances which are directly related to the official responsibilities of the officials. Officials granted the authority to sign and issue citations as provided in this subsection may delegate, with the approval of the governing body, the authority to employees. Authority delegated to an official or employee may be revoked only in the same manner by which it is conferred.

\*\*\*\*NOTE: The drafting instructions directed me to add the words "official or employee" following conservation warden in the first sentence of this paragraph. It was not clear whether you intended "official or employee" to refer to some other official or employee of the Department of Natural Resources who would be authorized to sign a citation or complaint, or whether you intended to refer to an official or employee of the municipality. If you intended the latter, I don't believe the addition of these words is necessary, as officials and employees of the municipality are expressly authorized to sign citations or complaints in the next sentence. Please advise.

Hi Laura,

I tried to call you but you were not available.

Everything looked great except for the provision relating to signatures. The municipalities would like to be able

to have officers or employees issue citations/complaints where the officer or employee name is either typewritten or hand printed on the citation/complaint. The definition of electronic signature does not really accomplish that goal.

Below is the proposed language we would like if possible.

**800.02(2)** FORM OF CITATION OR COMPLAINT. (a) The citation or complaint shall <u>contain</u> the name of a law enforcement officer, attorney representing the municipality, or if applicable, a conservation warden, <u>official</u>, or <u>employee</u>. In addition, the governing body of a municipality authorized to adopt the use of citations and complaints may designate by ordinance or resolution other municipal officials who <u>are authorized to issue and be named in citations or complaints</u> with respect to ordinances which are directly related to the official responsibilities of the officials. Officials granted the authority <u>to issue and be named in citations or complaints</u> may delegate, with the approval of the governing body, the authority to employees. Authority delegated to an official or employee may be revoked only in the same manner by which it is conferred.

#### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill eliminates the requirement that the citation be signed and, instead, requires only that the name of the signatory appear in the citation or complaint.

800.02 (2) (a) The citation or complaint shall be signed by contain the name of a law enforcement officer, attorney representing the municipality, or, if applicable, a conservation warden.
