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

SENATE SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT, TO 2011 SENATE BILL 499



AN ACT *to amend* 84.01 (13) of the statutes; **relating to:** the engagement of engineering and similar services by the Department of Transportation.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 84.01 (13) of the statutes is amended to read:

84.01 **(13)** Engineering services. The department may engage such engineering, consulting, surveying, or other specialized services as it deems advisable. Any engagement of services under this subsection is exempt from ss. 16.70 to 16.75, 16.755 to 16.82, and 16.85 to 16.89, but ss. 16.528, 16.752, 16.753, and 16.754 apply to such engagement. Any engagement involving an expenditure of \$3,000 or more shall be by formal contract approved by the governor. The department shall conduct a uniform cost–benefit analysis, as defined in s. 16.70 (3g), of each proposed engagement under this subsection that involves an estimated expenditure



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of more than \$25,000 \$100,000 in accordance with standards prescribed by rule of the department. The department shall review periodically, and before any renewal, the continued appropriateness of contracting pursuant to each engagement under this subsection that involves an estimated expenditure of more than \$25,000 \$100,000.

SECTION 2. Initial applicability.

(1) The treatment of section 84.01 (13) of the statutes first applies to engagements initially entered into on the effective date of this subsection.

Section 3. Effective date.

(1) This act takes effect on the first day of the 3rd month beginning after publication.
