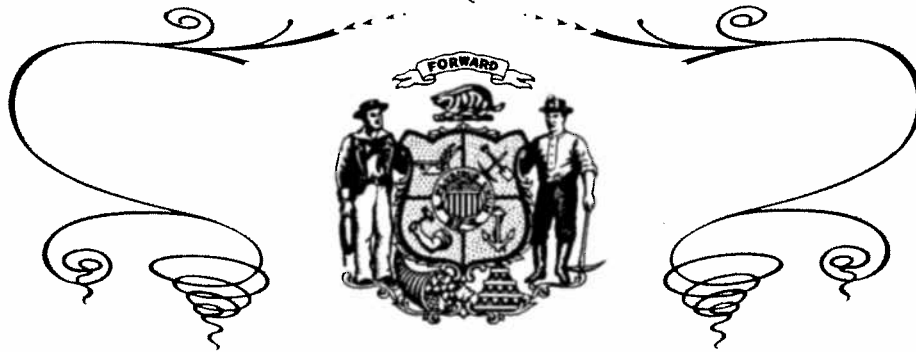

Whereas, Carl was elected to the state senate in 1982 to serve the citizens of Sheboygan, Manitowoc, Calumet, and Fond du Lac counties and served in this position until 1985; and

Whereas, Carl was both unwavering in his dedication to his core beliefs and respectful of those with whom he disagreed and dedicated his time in the legislature to helping those who were most in need; specifically, the poor, needy, elderly, and the mentally ill; and

Whereas, Carl continued to be active in his community following his retirement from the state senate by returning to serve on the county board; additionally, he kept a busy private life by volunteering at his local church, Good Shepherd Lutheran, participating in the Sheboygan Civic Orchestra, and engaging in a number of other recreational and community activities that he enjoyed greatly; and

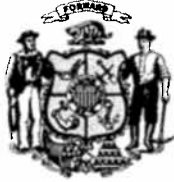
