Whereas, on February 20, 2011, Lieutenant Hidalgo, of Waukesha, Wisconsin, a member of Troop G, 3rd Squadron, 2nd Stryker Cavalry Regiment, died as a result of wounds received during enemy action in Kandahar Province, Afghanistan; and

Whereas, Lieutenant Hidalgo was a student of Kettle Moraine Middle School and Kettle Moraine High School, where he wrestled and was a member of the school band; and

Whereas, Lieutenant Hidalgo provided faithful and honorable service to the people of the state of Wisconsin and the people of the United States, as well as continuing a family military tradition by being commissioned as an officer in the United States Army on May 23, 2009, and proudly serving his tour of duty in Afghanistan; and

Whereas, Lieutenant Hidalgo made his family, his friends, and his country extremely proud of his courage and bravery as he made the ultimate sacrifice in service to his nation in fighting for the cause of freedom; and

Whereas, Lieutenant Hidalgo was laid to rest in West Point, New York, on Monday, March 7, 2011; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring, That the legislature of the state of Wisconsin commemorates the remarkable life of First Lieutenant Daren Miguel Hidalgo and extends its deepest sympathies to his family, friends, and colleagues; and, be it further

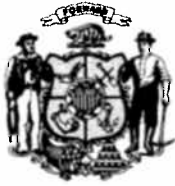
