Whereas, the Republic of China (Taiwan) is a vibrant democracy and economic powerhouse that protects human rights, governs through the rule of law, and continually seeks participation in international affairs; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the senate, That the members of the senate offer their congratulations to President Ma Ying-jeou on the centennial year of the founding of the Republic of China (Taiwan) and a century of social, political, and economic achievements; and, be it further

Resolved, That the senate chief clerk shall deliver a copy of this resolution to President Ma Ying-jeou of the Republic of China (Taiwan), Taiwan Governor Lin Junq-tzer, and Director General Perry Shen of the Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in Chicago.
