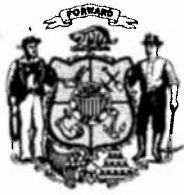

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

* Under current law, the Department of Commerce (Commerce) may allocate tax credits to certain businesses under the economic development tax credit program. The economic development tax credit program consolidates several economic development-related tax credit programs and provides that the total amount of credits allocated under the consolidated program may not exceed the sum of the tax credits remaining under the other programs. This bill provides that the total amount of credits that Commerce may allocate under the economic development tax credit program may not exceed \$25,000,000.

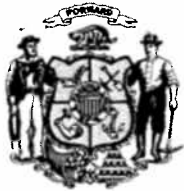

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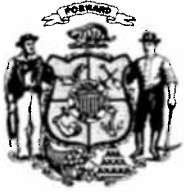

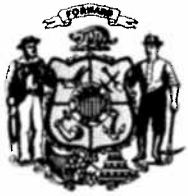
