Rep. Mason would also like a simple amendment drafted to SS AB 4 that takes the exact language from the attached 2009 << File: AB-513.pdf >> AB 513 re giving the Wisconsin Technical College System Board to award grants to Wisconsin Technical Colleges for programs that reduce unemployment. You can use the exact same eligibility criteria and language. So the amendment should divert the \$25 million proposed to be allocated in 2011 SS AB 4 and instead allocate it to those tech college grant purposes allowable under 2009 AB 513.

**Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau**

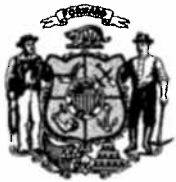
Under current law, the Department of Commerce (Commerce) may allocate tax credits to certain businesses under the economic development tax credit program. The economic development tax credit program consolidates several economic development-related tax credit programs and provides that the total amount of credits allocated under the consolidated program may not exceed the sum of the tax credits remaining under the other programs. This bill increases the total amount of credits that Commerce may allocate under the economic development tax credit program by \$25,000,000.

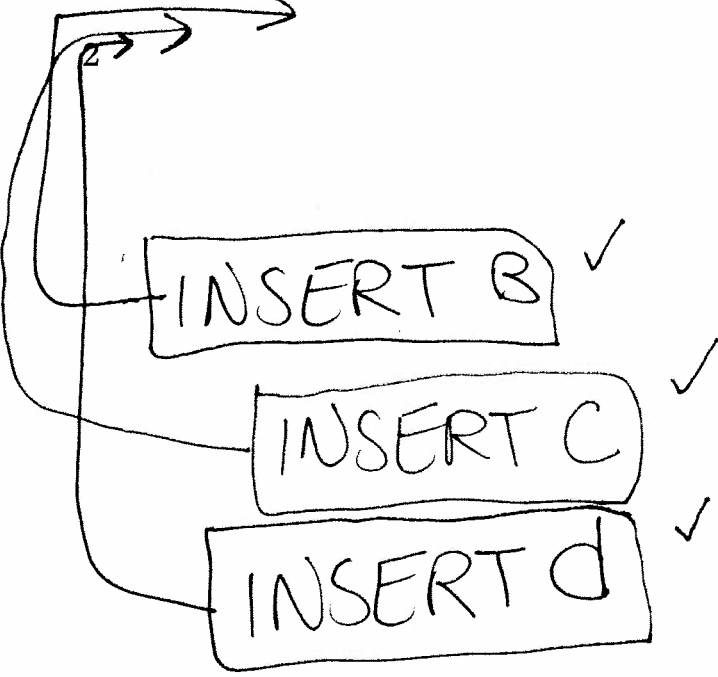

**Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau**

Under current law, there is appropriated to the Higher Educational Aids Board (HEAB) a sum sufficient equal to \$37,750,000 in the 2009-10 fiscal year and equal to \$58,345,400 in the 2010-11 fiscal year for Wisconsin higher education grants for University of Wisconsin (UW) System students (WHEG-UW grants).
