#### **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

Current law generally prohibits any person from operating a vehicle on a highway while towing two or more vehicles unless an exception applies or the operator holds an appropriate permit issued by DOT. DOT may issue permits for recreational three-vehicle combinations that consist of a towing vehicle, an RV or camping trailer, and a trailer for a personal recreation vehicle.

This bill eliminates the need to obtain a recreational three-vehicle combination permit and modifies the requirements for operation of three-vehicle combinations.

#### **FISCAL EFFECT**

DOT issued an average of 1,500 three-vehicle combinations annually over the past 3 years. The permits range in price from \$25 (consecutive monthly 3-month minimum) to \$40 for an annual permit, with an average issuance price of \$35.25. The elimination of these permits would result in a decrease in annual permit revenue of \$52,875.

DOT TCR Advanced staff spend an average of 6 minutes processing time on these permits. This results in an average of 9,000 minutes processing time annually, or 150 hours. This would result in the net reduction of work of .09 FTE. Including salary and fringe, this would result in a net FTE savings of \$5,340.
